

In February 2016, Her Excellency Reem Al Hashimy was sworn in as Minister of State for International Cooperation, in the UAE's Ministry of Foreign Affairs and International Cooperation. Additionally, she holds responsibility within the Cabinet, for the UAE's bilateral relations with Sub Saharan African countries and the Small Island Developing States (SIDS). Since her first ministerial appointment in February 2008, Her Excellency has and continues to manage, the Vice President's Office for Political Affairs, His Highness Sheikh Mohammed Bin Rashid Al Maktoum.

In November 2013, as Managing Director of Dubai's World Expo 2020 bid, Reem oversaw a historic success at the Bureau International des Expositions. Dubai Expo 2020 will be the first held in the MEASA (Middle East, Africa and South Asia region). Her Excellency holds the position of Managing Director of the Dubai Expo 2020 Higher Committee as well as Director General of the Dubai Expo 2020 Bureau, in preparation for the upcoming national milestone. Since its launch in 2007 by His Highness Sheikh Mohammed Bin Rashid Al Maktoum, Her Excellency has served as Chairperson of Dubai Cares, a philanthropic organisation with the aim of improving access to quality education in developing countries.

Her Excellency was formerly Chairperson of the Federal Competitiveness and Statistics Authority, which drives the UAE's global competitiveness across many sectors.

Her Excellency completed her undergraduate degree at Tufts University, earning a BA in International Relations and French, followed by an MA from Harvard University. Prior to her current position as Minister of State, Her Excellency served as Commercial Attaché, and subsequently Deputy Chief, of the UAE Embassy to the United States of America, in Washington DC

Dr Al Gurg is the Director of Strategy and Institutional Excellence and a member of the Health Policy faculty at Mohammed Bin Rashid University of Medicine and Health Sciences (MBRU). She graduated from the University of Sharjah, UAE with a BSc in Medical Lab Technology in 2004, before being awarded master's degrees from both King's College London, UK and the Royal College of Surgeons in Ireland, Dubai Campus, UAE. She subsequently undertook a PhD at the University of Bradford, UK, investigating 'The factors that influence nutrition intervention in the United Arab Emirates' healthcare system'.

Prior to her appointment at MBRU, Dr Al Gurg was Adjunct Faculty in the Health Science Department, Zayed University, Dubai and a Senior Executive of Medical Affairs at Dubai Health Care City, UAE.

Dr Al Gurg has been awarded several noteworthy accolades including the 'Best presentation at the E-health conference (HBMEU)' in 2009, the Sheikh Rashid award for 'Outstanding scientific research' (2016) and, this year, an 'Inspiring women in healthcare' award.

Philomena Raftery

Technical Officer,
WHO Health Emergencies
Programme in Cambodia



An experienced Global health professional with twenty years of work experience at both national and international levels, Philomena Raftery has, since 2015, been supporting developing countries in Africa and Asia to respond to outbreaks and to build laboratory systems for outbreak preparedness and response. In her current role as WHO Technical Officer in the WHE team in Cambodia, she coordinates the National laboratory response to the COVID-19 pandemic, and is playing a leading role in expansion of laboratory testing capacity for COVID-19 and facilitating the development of testing strategies and laboratory guidance to strengthen the response. In addition, she also coordinate laboratory partners and facilitates trainings to build diagnostic capacity, while frequently deputising as WHE Team lead and leading a team of >10 technical staff on the response to COVID-19 clusters and routine technical work. She also acts as Gender, Equity and Rights focal person in WHO Cambodia and Health Sector Lead within the Humanitarian Response Forum. In October, she led the health sector response to the National flooding disaster and coordinated and facilitated an in-house training on Gender, Equity and Rights for WHO staff.

Concurrent to her work at WHO, Philomena is pursuing a Doctorate of Public Health, at LSHTM. Through her studies, she has gained expertise on operational research and evidence based public health policy. Her research has included an analysis of the UK Public Health Rapid Support Team, an innovative team whose mandate combines operational research and outbreak response, giving her a deep appreciation of the need to integrate research in order to improve epidemic response. Through her thesis research, she is exploring GBV coordination mechanisms in humanitarian response in Lebanon, expected to be completed in 2021. Passionate about the global fight against gender-based violence (GBV), in 2019 she was selected to participate in the Managing GBV in Emergencies (MGBViE) training programme which gave her a strong understanding of implementing GBV prevention and response in emergency settings.

In her previous roles as WHO Laboratory Coordinator in Sierra Leone and Liberia, she provided technical guidance on diagnostics for infectious diseases and laboratory system strengthening, guiding policy and strategic planning. She also contributed to building national preparedness and response capacity for viral haemorrhagic fevers and AMR, and worked with multi-sectorial Ministries and international partners across the one health platform, coordinating and facilitating several laboratory trainings. In Sierra Leone, she frequently deputised as WHE Cluster Coordinator and was responsible for project management ensuring optimal use of donor funding. In Liberia, she led a dynamic team to coordinate laboratory outbreak preparedness and response during the Ebola epidemic.

Jennifer Schechter

Co-Founder and CEO,

Jennifer Schechter has been building innovative healthcare solutions since 2005, when she opened Integrate Health's first rural HIV treatment center while serving as a US Peace Corps Volunteer in Togo. Since taking on the role of CEO in 2012, Ms. Schechter has helped to expand Integrate Health's impact in the fight to end preventable deaths of women and children. Working in the marginalized nation of Togo, Integrate Health collaborates with the Togolese Ministry of Health to implement and test proactive, integrated, community health delivery innovations.

Since January 2020, Integrate Health has worked alongside the Ministry of Health to mount a proactive response to the COVID-19 pandemic. In addition to raising nearly 1M USD to procure supplies and improve infrastructure, Integrate Health facilitated Togo's participation in the COVID-19 Action Fund for Africa, resulting in the delivery of over 1.3 million units of personal protective equipment (PPE) designated for Community Health Workers. Integrate Health has also demonstrated the importance of continuity of care, continuing all program delivery and even expanding to new geographies during the pandemic. The innovations developed by Integrate Health and the Togolese Ministry of Health are contributing to the global movement to bring about systems-level change in the way primary healthcare is delivered. Under Ms. Schechter's leadership, Integrate Health has been recognized by the Clinton Global Initiative and supported by a number of social impact investors. Ms. Schechter is a Rainer Arnhold Fellow with the Mulago Foundation, a recipient of the Sargent Shriver Award for Distinguished Humanitarian Service and a recipient of the Cordes Fellowship. She is also a member of the Advisory Board for the Community Health Impact Coalition. Ms. Schechter received a Bachelor of Science in International Politics from Georgetown University and Master's degrees of Social Work and Public Health from the University of Washington.

Hassan Al Hashemi joined Dubai Chamber of Commerce & Industry in 2006 and is currently the Vice President of International Relations. She was also Head of Corporate Affairs and Communications at Provident until 2015, where she oversaw the development and implementation of a successful reputation building strategy, and led the improvement of the company culture and employee engagement leading to Provident being awarded the "Best Workplace Award" in 2012 and 2014.

Professor Nino Künzli
Dean, Swiss School of Public Health; Senior Environmental Epidemiologist, Swiss Tropical and Public Health Institute, Basel, Switzerland



With an MD from the University of Basel and both an MPH and a PhD from University of California Berkeley (USA), Nino Künzli has a 30 year record of research in environmental epidemiology. Appointed as Associate Professor to the University of Southern California (2002–2005) and as ICREA Professor Barcelona (2006–2009) his research focus remained ambient air pollution and its cardiorespiratory health effects. His air pollution research includes exposure science, epidemiologic research and the integration of both into health impact assessment to serve policy makers. Künzli regularly serves on policy-relevant committees such as WHO or as President of the Swiss Federal Commission on Air Hygiene – the advisory board of the Swiss Government. He is currently a member of the international Guideline Development Group of WHO to update the WHO Air Quality Guidelines – a global point of reference for clean air policy making.

As Head of the Bachelor-Master-Doctorate unit at Swiss TPH, member of the Medical Faculty and Dean of the Swiss School of Public Health, he is engaged in teaching and training on the graduate, PhD, and postgraduate level. He leads initiatives to strengthen inter-disciplinary, inter-faculty and inter-university PhD tracks such as the SSPH+ Inter-university Graduate Campus and the University Basel Graduate School Health Sciences to foster the public health sciences careers of the youngest generation of research talents. Under his SSPH+ leadership, the Foundation has become the national inter-university multidisciplinary faculty of public health sciences all across twelve Swiss universities.

His expertise includes providing advice and technical assistance to policy makers on prevention and management of mental, developmental, neurological and substance use disorders and suicide prevention. He is contributing actively to Global Mental Health at Harvard initiative.
